**RE: PROVISIONAL LEARNING ASSESSMENT RESULTS**

***A: CANDIDATES WHO HAD CARRIED FORWARD SOME MODULES THEY HAD FAILED IN SEMESTER 1 TO SEMESTER 2***

A.1: Candidates were required to pass (*getting 30 or more marks out of 60*) in semester examination in ALL modules that they had carried forward to 2<sup>nd</sup> semester.

A.2: A candidate who has failed in one or more of the modules is required to RE-SIT the semester exam as “private” candidate in the module (s) s/he has failed when the exam is next offered.

A.3: A candidate who has failed in one or more of the modules SHALL NOT be allowed to undertake studies in the next higher NTA level even if s/he has passed ALL the 2<sup>nd</sup> semester modules until s/he has passed the semester exam in ALL the modules that s/he had carried forward to 2<sup>nd</sup> semester and failed the exam.

***B: CANDIDATES WHO SAT FOR SECOND SEMESTER EXAM (FIRST SITTING)***

B.1: Candidates were required to have passed the continuous assessment (CA) (*getting 20 or more marks out of 40*) in ALL prescribed modules for the semester before sitting for semester exam in those modules. ALL had passed the CA in ALL the prescribed modules.

B.2: In order to pass the semester, candidates were required to pass the semester exam (SE) (*getting 30 or more marks out of 60*) in ALL prescribed modules for the semester. Some DID NOT pass in some modules.

B.3: Module marks (M) is the sum of CA and SE

B.4: Module grade (G) is assigned according the following schedule: F (0-39), D (40-49), C (50-64), B (65-79), and A (80-100), except if a candidate did not pass the SE and  $M \geq 50$ , then the grade assigned for that module is D.

B.5: Module grade points (GP) are assigned according to the following schedule: F (0), D (1), C (2), B (3), and A (4).

B.6: Each module is assigned credits (CR) which are directly proportional to number of hours required for the student to learn and master ALL the competences prescribed for that module through lectures, tutorials, practical lessons, and independent study.

B.7: Grade points average (GPA) for the semester is calculated from the following formula:  $GPA = \frac{\sum(GP \times CR)}{\sum(CR)}$

B.8: A candidate is considered to have PASSED the semester if s/he has passed (*getting  $GP \geq 2$* ) in ALL the prescribed modules. A candidate is considered to have NOT PASSED the semester if s/he has failed (*getting  $GP < 2$* ) in ONE or MORE of the prescribed modules.

B.9: Performance level of candidates who have PASSED the semester is indicated by CLASS according to the following schedule of GPA values: 1<sup>st</sup> class (3.5-4.0), 2<sup>nd</sup> class (3.0-3.4), and PASS Class (2.0-2.9).

**B.10: A candidate who has NOT PASSED one or more modules but has attained  $GPA \geq 2$  shall be required to sit for Supplementary exam in the modules s/he has failed. The Supplementary Exam is scheduled on 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> July 2010.**

B.11: A candidate who has NOT PASSED one or modules and has attained  $GPA < 2$  has been DISCONTINUED from studies.

B.12: Results have been WITHHELD for candidates who are in debt (*have not completed payment of fees and other dues FY 2009/10*).
